Chief Minister's Canberra Gold Award





Presidents Report for 2016

In February 2016 ACT Property Group let us know that 'Kurrajong' was being considered for government use. We were told we would have vacate the premises and they would help us find alternative accommodation. This led us to set up an accommodation sub-committee to make decisions concerning our relocation. This committee has found new accommodation, which we will be sharing with the Canberra Region Feltmakers. The ACT Property Group agreed to us subletting to CRF.

This year CSW also celebrated its 50th birthday. To celebrate this milestone we made submissions to Canberrra Galleries for Exhibitions next year. Two of these submissions were accepted. We have an historical exhibition at Canberra Museum and Gallery planned from 31 October 2017 until 18 March 2018 and a members' exhibition, '50 years Looking Forward', at the Tuggeranong Arts Centre from 2 to 25 November 2017. We also applied for grants to cover the costs of these exhibitions and were awarded one to cover the members' exhibition at TAC.

With all this activity coming up in 2017 we decided to hold a planning day on 22 October 2017. This was facilitated by Adelin Chin, an Arts Advocate, who had previously given advice to the accommodation subcommittee. This led to the development of a strategic plan for the association. Thank you to all who participated in a very full day and all the work that followed.

Apart from these activities CSW participated in all its normal activities. As usual February saw us at the Royal Canberra Show where, thanks to Val Walker and Liz Jarvis, we won the award for the best demonstration. Congratulations to all winners.

On 14 April we hosted a Visitors Day. This was very successful with visitors coming from Yass, Goulburn and Cooma. Thanks to everyone who helped with the catering.

Instead of an exhibition in May this year we held a Display and Sale at our premises in Ainsle. Thanks to a wonderful team led by Lynne Johnson this was extremely successful.

In July we demonstrated at the Creative Fibre day at the Kingston Markets.

In November the Greenhills retreat was very successful. There was a lot of 'show and tell' for inspiration as well as all the mini workshops.

We held our end of year party on November 15.

There were various workshops including beginner spinning and beginner weaving courses, a double weave workshop and two kumihimo workshops.

During the year we had a variety of speakers at our meetings - Dimity Kidston a tapestry weaver, Vera Delova a textile artist, Marianna Ortega a visiting tapestry weaver from Mexico, Helen Cox from CRF, Di Ballantyne from the Embroiderers' Guild, Meredith Hinchliffe curator of our exhibitions, Monique van Nieuwland, and Ann McMahon from Basketry Group.

The various groups continued meeting throughout the year. Thank you to all the co-ordinators.

I would also like to thank all those people who contributed to the smooth running of CSW, particularly everyone on the committee, and everyone who participated in any of the events. Congratulations to Monique who had work in the 15th International Triennial of Tapestry at Lodz, Poland.

TREASURERS REPORT

I am pleased to present the 2016 report of the finances of the Canberra Spinners and Weavers Inc. My thanks are extended to the many members who have assisted during the year in the collection of Guild funds on my behalf.

BY BUS: Catch the 21 or 22 bus from Woden – more details on:


