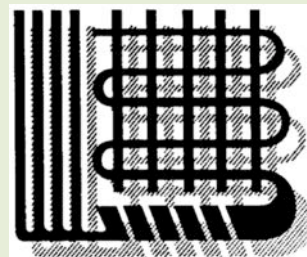
Many Hands Make New Work

There will be a display and sale of members work at Textile Works on the 18 and 19 May. All work is to be for sale, and will follow the usual Association guidelines for sale items. In brief, knitted and crochet items are to contain a large percentage of hand spun yarn. Commercial yarn is acceptable for hand knitted socks, and weaving. Items that members submitted for sale at the November open days will be accepted in this sale, woolly hats and socks hopefully will be greeted with more enthusiasm!

Collection of items will be on **Tuesday 15th May** between **12** and **2pm** and again from **5 -7pm**. Items will need to have a CSW swing tag attached and be submitted with an entry form. Items will attract \$1 per item entry fee up to \$20 for 20 items, however we will accept 30 items per member for \$20. CSW will levy a 20% commission for items sold.

Set-up for this display will take place on the Thursday 17th May. Thursday's spinning group will be held in the Tenants room on that day.

Members wishing to sell items are encouraged to help with the sales and demonstrations during the open days. There will be signup sheets in the kitchen. Please consider making some time available to participate. We need weavers, spinners, rag ruggers, tapestry weavers, knitters to come along and demonstrate our skills.

ITEMS FROM THE MOST RECENT JOINT ACCOMMODATION MEETING

The Committee agreed to a priority list that as joint tenants we would work towards to improve the premises for all users.

Our first was to install tracking for joint exhibitions in our rooms at Textile Works. This has now been done and a big thank you to Liz Jarvis's partner Adam. The tracking was paid for jointly from monies accrued in our joint bank account.

We are now working on the acoustics in the main meeting room and we are looking for woven, knitted, felted 7.5 cm squares which will be mounted on acoustic pin board. Once the squares are collected we will have a working bee to attach the squares to the board.

The third priority is the dishwasher. We would like to install a dishwasher under the bench but this will take a few more sausage sizzles to achieve!

I also need to remind the membership that we share these rooms and we need to respect all members of both the CRF and CSW. Weekends are a busy time at Textile Works with sharing of our rooms due to workshops and regular groups meeting. Please, if there is a workshop in progress **do not enter the meeting room unless invited**. You may enter the Foyer/Gallery area from the corridor, but please restrict the noise so as not to interrupt the participants attending the workshop. The tenants rooms are booked and have a kitchen, which can be used. We will investigate a box of comestibles to be used in the tenants room, to alleviate the need to go to the kitchen when the main room is in use, so watch this space.

The other issue that has come to my attention is that of recyclables, and garbage. Please only put cardboard, plastics, glass in the recycle bin - **no food, tea bags or coffee cups. Do not use a plastic bin liner** in the recycle bin as these are ending up in the hopper and CSW has been pinpointed as the culprit. If it continues we risk being fined! I would also remind all users of the rooms to empty the bins especially if full. This is everyone's responsibility and not to be left for the cleaner.

The CRF are addressing the above issues and I hope we can find a way to cohabit harmoniously at Textile Works.

AGM PRESIDENT'S REPORT - 2018

This 2017/18 year has seen a lot of change for Canberra Spinners and Weavers. Reflecting on our achievements is quite remarkable and it is easy to see how quickly the year has passed since the last AGM.

Moving from Kurrajong to the Chifley Hub was both emotionally and physically challenging for the association; however 11 months later members are beginning to enjoy some of the added benefits in being part of a larger community collective. Our partnership with the Canberra Regional Felters in sharing our premises has posed a few issues, but we have worked and will continue to negotiate for the benefit of all our members of both Associations. It is only through this partnership that we are able to financially afford a permanent home for CSW.

This year we took time to celebrate our 50 year heritage and honoured past and present members of the association, by holding two exhibitions. 'Crossing Threads - 50 years looking back' at Canberra Museum and Gallery (show-casing works obtained from private and public collections) and our current members' exhibition held at the Tuggeranong Art Gallery, both curated by Meredith Hinchliffe, brought us into the media spotlight. We also successfully nominated our member Fay Skyring for an Order of Australia Medal, for her services to weaving in the Canberra Community.

Our Exhibitions were only made possible by the hard work of Liz Perry and Monique van Nieuwland in their grant writing skills, as we were successful in being awarded an Arts ACT Grant. As part of the grant writing procedure we needed to cite our Strategic Plan! The Committee, with the help of Adeline Chin as an outside facilitator, set about writing and implementing a plan for the association. As part of this process you will remember we sent out a members survey as we value your input into the organisation. So the association now has a direction in which to travel.

As part of 'the plan' there have been changes to our monthly members meetings, which now have much more of an emphasis on our crafts and textiles. We continue to have a speaker at some meetings but at other meetings we focus on our various interest groups. This past year we had a great talk from the knitting group, which generated a lot of interest and discussion from the floor. We are very fortunate to have such a diverse and interesting group so that our speakers have largely come from our membership this year. We took trips with Ondrae Campbell, Liz Perry, and Monique to Europe, Cambodia and Vietnam, travelled down memory lane with Esther Macdonald and explored innovative textile art forms with our 3 EASS 17/18 awardees.

In November we participated in 'Design Canberra' by opening our rooms over 3 days with demonstrations and sales of members work. Estelle Canning kindly potted up some of the dye plants from the Kurrajong garden which were sold during the open days. This event allowed the public to visit and see what we had to offer whilst being encouraged to stop for a cuppa so ably made by Christine Gale. This is the first time we have been part of a larger Canberra Arts event, and whilst moderately successful, we anticipate being more involved in the future.

Our workshop convenor has worked very hard to secure some excellent tutors in tapestry weaving, dyeing, advanced spinning and weaving as well as a very interesting design workshop. This all happened along with 'our learn to spin' and 'learn to weave' classes. There has been something for everyone wishing to learn new skills!

This year we experimented with increasing the length of our stay at the Greenhills Getaway. Instead of finishing on the Sunday afternoon people left after breakfast on the Monday. This seemed to work well for people travelling long distances. My thanks to the committee of Helen Hamilton, Jeannie McLellan and Carleen Jones for a very relaxed and interesting weekend.

In July we had a joint day with the CRF as a way of a friendship, 'getting to know you' event. Both associations demonstrated their skills and craft and it was an interesting day for those who attended. February this year the two associations have embarked on a joint project 'Many Hands make New Work'. We hope the finished items will be auctioned at a joint 'Wine and Cheese Tasting' in November '18.

Canberra Spinners and Weavers is now well represented on social media with 'face book' and through our web site. Our thanks go to Ruby Berry in maintaining and updating our details. This means members and non-members are able to view the association's activities. So we are gradually moving into the 21st Century and allowing people to book and interact on-line - this we hope will improve over the next year.

The Canberra Show this year provided members with the opportunity to display their work, and for some their work received commendations and prizes. All the prize-winning work from both the Feltmakers and CSW will be displayed in the Foyer Gallery here at Textile Works from the 20th March '18.

Our shop is growing ever bigger and better. This is an important source of revenue for the association. There is now not only fibre for spinning but weaving yarns as well. The association has also joined Danish Kooperative Yarns and has the catalogue in the library. These yarns can be purchased as a joint order or independently.

Alexis Yeadon, our tireless librarian, is standing down from the Committee this year having been on the committee since 1988. A big thank you to Alexis for all her work on the committee. Alexis will continue on as our Librarian and provide us with publications to delight our senses!

CSW continues to support the ANU Emerging Artists Scheme and this year awarded 4 memberships to the graduating students. Two of the awardees Christine Appleby, and Jessie Fitzpatrick were in the Textile Area, but Rachel Bilal and Caitlin Woodford show promise in textile knowledge incorporating weaving in sculpture and spinning in printmaking. It is hoped that we will have talks from these 4 members during the coming year.

Moving to Chifley has cost the association financially, not only is there increased rent, but we had to paint, purchase a container for equipment storage, buy a new computer, printer etc. However through Val Walker's careful management of our funds we remain in a good financial situation. I would like to thank Val for all the hard work looking after the association's books for many years. Val is stepping down as Treasurer but will continue to be a member of the committee looking after our equipment.

The Committee this year has worked tirelessly behind the scenes throughout what has been a most unusual year. I want to thank them all for all their support and their readiness to jump in and help when required. I think CSW is well positioned to face a very bright future with new and exciting activities whilst maintaining our core business of spinning and weaving.
