

We thank them for their amazing organisational skills in drawing our 'getaway' together for several years, and making it such a happy occasion.

Whilst I am on the thank yous I want to thank Jenny Harber for helping to give us a little taste of our past history in planting a kurrajong tree out in the tan bark patch by the top door. Please give it a drink when you pass by and may it grow as the kurrajongs did in Ainslie! I also want to pass on the Association's best wishes and congratulations to Barbara Stanilewicz on her 90th birthday. This is a milestone to be celebrated - happy birthday Barbara.

At the last members meeting I flagged changes to our monthly members meetings. The committee is looking at having bi-monthly Saturday meetings on the 3rd Saturday of the month. This would give us meetings in February, April, June, August and October. The meetings will be held on the same Saturday as Tapestry weaving and HOW's. The meeting will be informal and may be around a shared lunch so that the morning attendees would stay on and network. 
You may renew most items for another month but new books, magazines and DVDs should not be renewed so that others have a chance to enjoy them as well.
